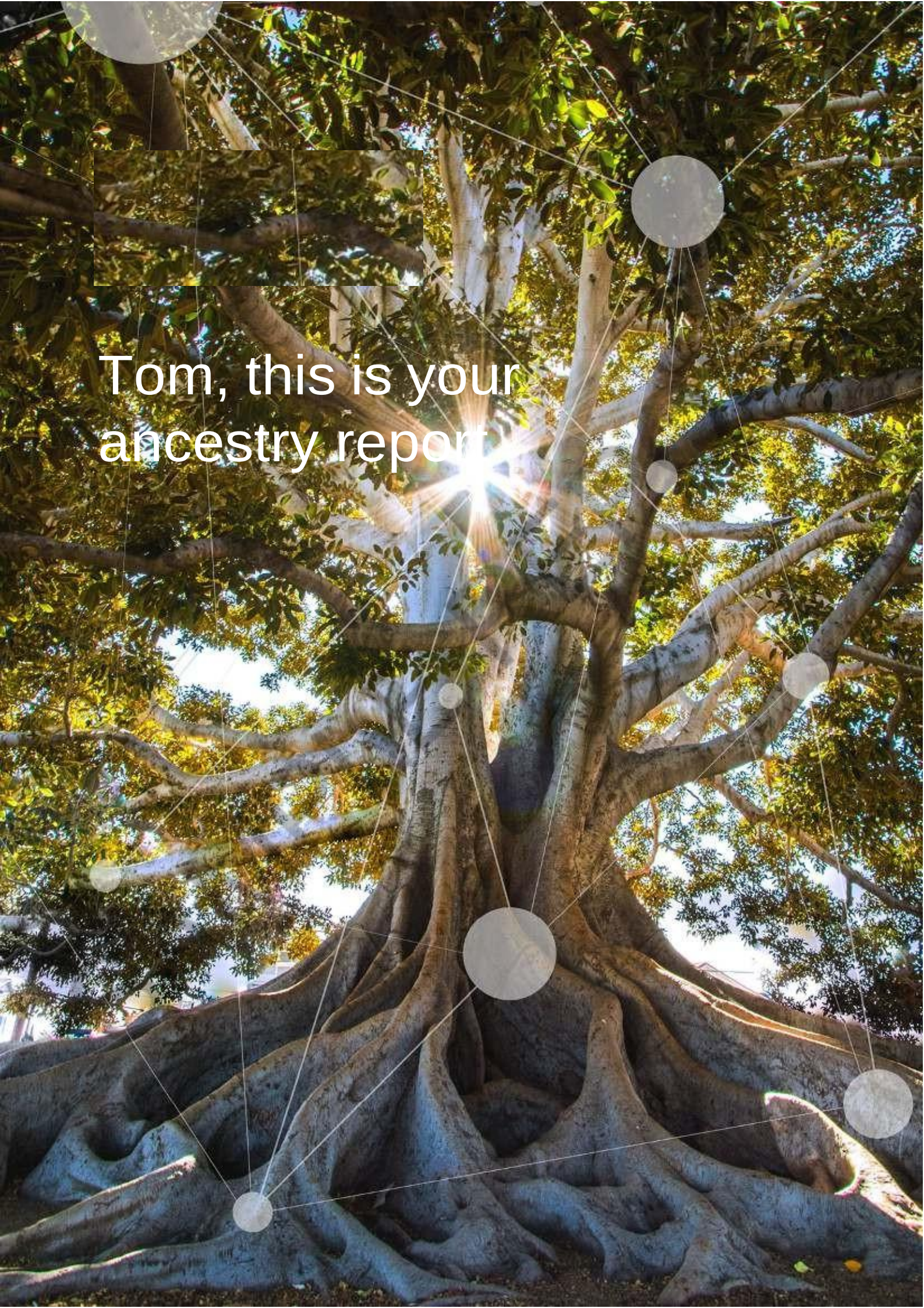

Introduction

The data presented in this report are only statistical approximations. However, thanks to our test, featuring 700,000 genetic markers, we can achieve a great level of detail.

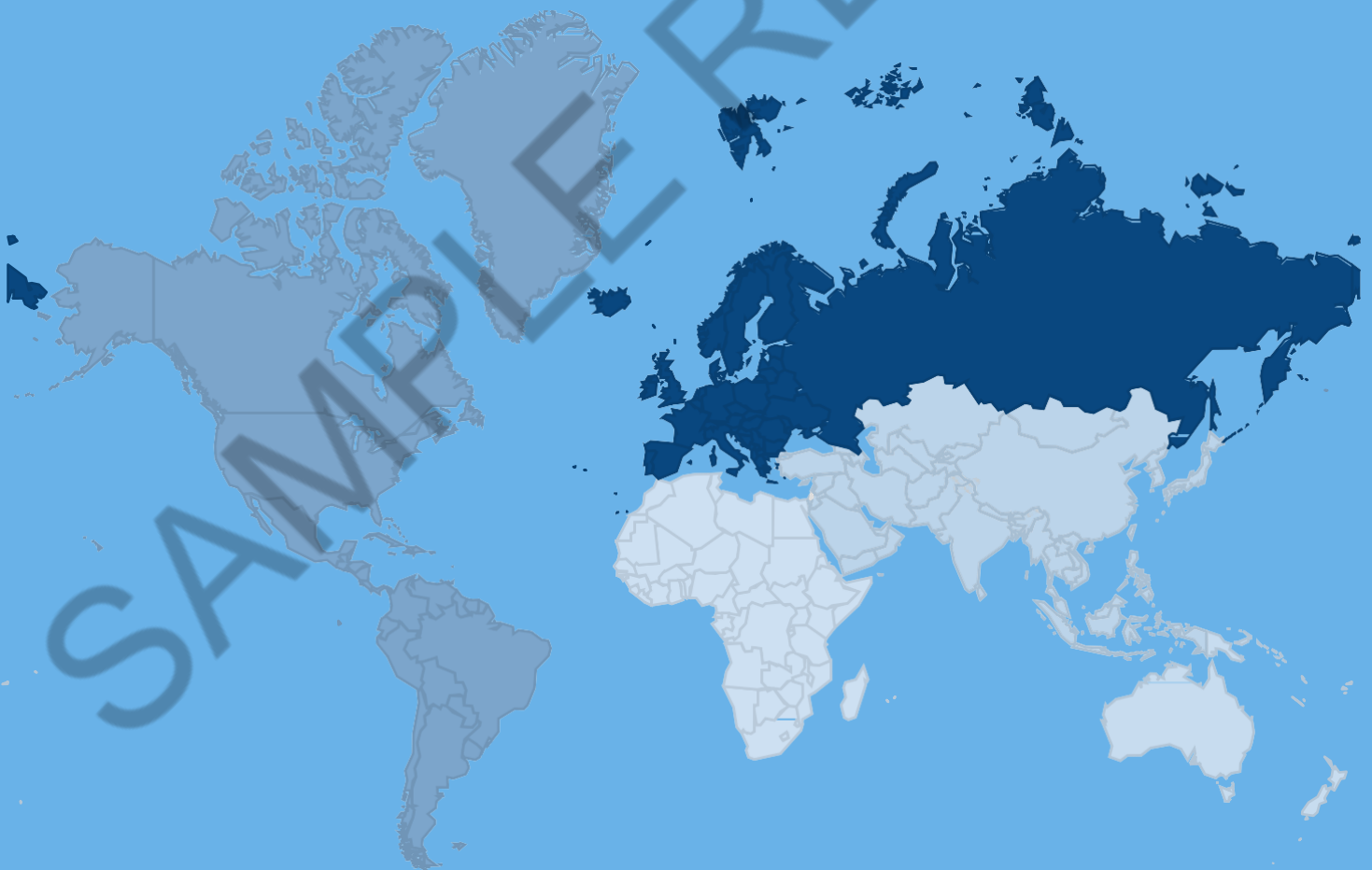
